I am nervous about seven days because it is arbitrary on my part. It may well be that it is too short. It probably ought to be longer but at least it clarifies more than what it was. Let me add, I am not in support of the bill even if the amendment gets on so it is not that kind of a situation. Just trying to make a bad bill not quite as bad.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Warner amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.
