

manufacturer the same. It allows for so little knowledge and intent to be shown that, in fact, the person who makes thousands and thousands of crates of these things and distributes them and advertises them is committing the same level of criminality or expressing the same culpability in their actions as somebody who simply pans as an intermediary a look-alike substance from one person to another. The bill does not distinguish between those situations and because they don't distinguish it is not well enough written. Senator Chambers offers this with amendments one and three, a better way to write the bill and in that case I support him. What I do not like in the notion of this floor is if you object to the way the bill is written, somehow you are objecting to the goal and that thinking cannot guide us for the rest of this session. We have to be careful about how we write bills and that we fight about how they are written should not be attacked as being somehow unsympathetic to the goals of the bills. It is not simply enough to show some sort of pledge of allegiance to the goal and then we have to adopt every form in which we capture that goal by legislative language. We have to pay attention to where the commas are, where the periods are, where the ors and the ands and the mayes and the shalls. That is our business and we should attend to that carefully.
