

Chambers amendment. Please record your vote if you wish to vote. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the first Chambers amendment.

PRESIDENT: The first item number one is adopted. Proceed...number three. Do you want to do number three now since it was connected in the debate? We are voting now on item number three of the Chambers amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed...Senator Beutler. It is debatable, yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I think maybe we should clarify now what we are voting on because I'm sure everybody is a little confused, at least I am a little confused. I take it, Mr. Clerk, that we are now voting on the second "and"?

PRESIDENT: Line 4.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, this is the one in line 5 of page 4 which changes "or" to "and". Is that correct?

CLERK: That is my understanding, Senator, yes, sir.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I think it is a difficult question which way you want to go on this and/or, but I do think that this and/or change makes a very significant change in the bill and you will want to consider carefully which way you want to go. Under the bill the way it is constructed right now, there are a couple of different situations that...

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I don't want to object to Senator Beutler at this moment, but when we called the question we were calling the question on a divided series of votes on one matter which was the Chambers amendments. Having closed on the amendments in their totality, do we not simply proceed to three different votes on those amendments and the question has been called, which means there is no further debate.
