PRESIDENT: The amendment is not adopted. Now we are on to item number two which is debatable if you wish, item number two of the Chambers amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: With the indulgence of this long-suffering body, I would ask unanimous consent, if I may, to withdraw that one.

PRESIDENT: You may, Senator, if there is no objection and there is none. Now are we back to the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I have no further amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: No further amendments to the bill. Senator Hoagland. Nothing further to say on the bill? Your pending motion then would be to advanced to E & R, correct? DeCamp. Senator DeCamp, do you wish to say something?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, Mr. President. Over the years I've sat in on the debate in Judiciary and other committees and on the floor on the whole drug issue, the look-alikes, the whole picture. I think in the early years I think I sponsored or co-sponsored just about all of it with Senator Schmit, with Senator Chambers, with some of the others. I guess I've learned a little bit, over those years, and that is that what we think we absolutely know were the magic solutions we think we absolutely have may not always be as magic as we think. I'd like to suggest something about ourselves. Probably between 40 and 45 of us are white, middle class, probably upper middle class, too wealthy. We probably overall, as a group, 40 or 45, or 47 of us, have about as little knowledge about the drug scene, what goes on, who is involved, as just about anybody. In fact, if we were going to go down to, oh, I'm going to say the average college dorm and pick any 15 kids, any half dozen of them could probably provide you more information on the subject in depth and what will work, what won't work than the entire body collectively. I do believe historically, in this body, Senator Chambers, whatever my other disagreements with him have been over the years, probably individually has as much knowledge as any human being in this body and maybe in the state on this scene. He probably has as much experience as to what will work or won't work, and when I use the word "work", I mean simply what, in the total picture, benefits
