SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Are you going to ask for an A bill on this? Is there going to be an A bill?

SENATOR WESELY: There has been one prepared, yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: And it is for how much?

SENATOR WESELY: Well, I think it is for like twenty or thirty thousand dollars. Let me...I know...

SENATOR HABERMAN: In other words...in other words, the fiscal note that I have in front of me is not accurate because it states the program is currently being funded through the Title 12 block grant within the Department of Social Services. Now that indicates to me it is being supported by federal funds. Now we are hearing on this floor this morning that the Appropriations Committee is considering, we don't know how much, we don't know whether we are going to use state funds. The Social Service Department has asked for \$200,000 to support this program. So I don't like to be confused like this, Senator Wesely, when we have a fiscal note that doesn't show actually what is going on and I thought that it was a rule of this body that every bill that we received had a fiscal note that had any impact upon the general fund.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Time is up.

SENATOR HABERMAN: So I just don't, I just don't understand what is going on, Senator Wesely, and I think the body ought to be made aware of what is going on because we don't know what is going on and that is dangerous because you can get stuck with \$200,000 if we pass the bill. Then they can come back later, say, well, you passed the bill, now we need two hundred thousand, or twenty thousand, or what have you, so I think we are getting the cart before the horse. Now I know the bill is going to pass. I can just feel it.
