

CLERK: Senator Pappas changing from no to yes. Senator Hannibal voting yes. Senator Landis voting yes. Senator Chizek voting yes.

PRESIDENT: The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: Twenty...Senator, I'm sorry, Senator Higgins...

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins, did you wish...

CLERK: I think Senator Higgins wanted a record vote, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins, did you want a record vote?

CLERK: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Record vote has been called for.

CLERK: Senator Johnson voting yes. Senator Morehead voting no. Senator Withem voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted?

CLERK: Senator Wesely voting no.

PRESIDENT: Go ahead and record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. LB 299 advances to E & R for review. The next item on the agenda is LB 290.

CLERK: Mr. President, 290, it's a bill offered by Senator Harris. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 17, referred to the Retirement Systems Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Harris, go ahead with the committee amendments.
