

again the attorneys will read it different. I can give you an example. When we built Highway 81 they did provide a reasonable road to Stromsburg, a reasonable road. They had to go about six miles around and about way to get to Stromsburg. Stromsburg lost a lot of business. It took us a year to build that road and they did lose business. But they want the road. They are tickled to death to get the road. Now they are going to put a bridge right on the outside of Stromsburg. What are we going to do, have to build another road over that Lincoln Creek to get to Stromsburg to make it reasonable so they don't have to go so far? That is what will happen. These are the kind of things that I foresee. Yet this road is very, very important to those people. Now you talk about counties. In my own situation I had two bridges that were out for all winter, all spring. I had to drive five extra miles to get from one farm to another. Did I complain? Sure, I complained a little because it cost me money, but I wouldn't change it because I am just happy as all get out to get those bridges in. Would I want another little...if you would have it reasonable, you would have to have a road bypass that creek so that I wouldn't have to drive so far. No, I don't want that. I think these are the kind of things we are talking about. And as Senator Warner said, do we want the gas tax to increase? No, we don't want it, but we will see it increase, I am sure, in a year or two if we pass this bill. Thank you.
