

PRESIDENT: Very well. Under those rules, the Chair does say that LB 272 shall be laid over. And then we move to LB 337.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 337 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 337 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Please record your vote on the final passage of LB 337. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 663-64 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 43 ayes, 0 nays, 5 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed. Next the Clerk will read LB 338.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 338 on Final Reading.)
