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or purchase those items that you need basically before you go out and do something differently. But I, too, have a concern because I would quite agree that the holding of the A bills on Final Reading has not resulted in A bills not being passed. Essentially they all go. In fact they go swish and that has concerned me and I was doing something this session twice on two different bills which I was a little uncomfortable about, but two different bills I have supported along with others, holding them on General File because they had a general fund impact. One was fairly sizeable, the other was relatively insignificant. But I was concerned that if those bills and all the rest of them like it got to Final Reading they would be just as Senator DeCamp has suggested, they just...they go. So I had visited with Senator Morehead. I visited with Senator Lynch the day that we held his bill up so that he was aware of where I was coming from, that I think that some adjustment, some review at least of that process is in order and I think that we should take a little time to think it through, Senator DeCamp, of exactly where we are at. But I think that there is merit in some approach. Now once upon a time any A bill that was under a certain dollar amount was not held and they were, I think \$50,000, if I remember right, was the figure. Well, that didn't work too good because everybody would figure out a way to have their new program cost under \$50,000 the first year and sometimes those figures weren't quite accurate by the next year. You found out that instead of a fifty it was a hundred and fifty. But in any event, that artificial dollar figure was not a desirable or workable way either. But I agree that we ought to review that process and find a better way than we now have and I'm certainly supportive of doing that and I guess I'd suggest, Senator DeCamp, if you would consider having your rule change go to the Rules Committee and see if we can really work out a change in the process that would be beneficial to the body as a whole as we try to arrive at a total dollar figure.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, you are entitled to speak on the amendment.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, incredible as it sounds, I and Senator Warner I think are on the same side on this even though it may surprise him. I believe the process that we have developed of parking all the A bills there on the line has in fact resulted in passage, significantly, of more
