

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, any further discussion on the advancement of the bill? Now we're back to the bill. I said a minute ago we'd take it some other day. I thought that we had some more discussion on the kill motion, but since that's been withdrawn, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to? Senator Schmit, what do you think?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well, Mr. President, I suggest we have a call of the house and take call in votes, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Please return to your seats if you're not already there and record your presence. Those not in the Chamber please return to the Chamber and record your presence. How many are excused, Mr. Clerk? Six are excused, Senator Schmit. Front row senators please record your presence. I see several of you out there who have not pushed your green button. Please push your green button. Senator Harris. Thank you. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, while you're doing that, for that Livestock Feeders Association, where did you say the cattle trucks would be lined up? (Laughter.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: We're looking for Senator Landis and Senator Scofield. A roll call vote has been requested and we're voting on the advancement of the bill. You did not request a roll call, Senator DeCamp? Did you want to take call in votes then? Senator Schmit, did you wish to take call in votes or did you want a roll call or what did you want? Pardon me? Call in votes are authorized. We're voting on the advancement of the bill.

CLERK: Senator Scofield voting yes. Senator Abboud voting no. Senator Vard Johnson changing from no to yes. Senator Hall changing from no to yes.
