

handling people and tell other people what to do you are in a supervisory capacity and that's where our fear is. And of course the Court of Industrial Relations will be involved. And of course when these people belong to the union, that doesn't necessarily say they will, but if they do, then we begin to have problems. And you must remember, we have 40 nursing homes that are public nursing homes and there could be a union in every one of them. That doesn't necessarily say there will be, but there could be and I know that there are a couple of others that are talking about joining a union. So this is possible and that is why I am supporting this amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Sieck amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Four are excused. Senator Sieck. Okay, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
