SPEAKER NICHOL: I have two lights on. Do you wish to speak to the amendment, Senator Vickers?

SENATOR VICKERS: I want to speak to the resolution, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We are on the amendments now, did you want...

SENATOR VICKERS: I will just speak to the resolution. I will wait on that.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. Senator DeCamp, did you wish to speak about the amendments? Senator DeCamp. Okay. The question is the adoption of the amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the adoption of the amendments to the resolution. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Schmit's amendment to LR 51, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendments are adopted. Senator Vickers, we are back to the resolution itself.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, I just rise to support the resolution. I agree with many of the points that Senator Schmit made. I want to point out to the body that this is one of the policy decisions that were made in Chicago a couple of weeks ago when Senator Schmit, Senator Johnson, and myself were back there visiting with delegations from the other states that are going to be joining us this next week. This is one of the issues that was raised, one of the agreed upon points that we, as representatives of the agricultural states, should ask for and I commend Senator Schmit with drafting the resolution and getting it before this body before we do make that trek to Washington. I would urge adoption of this resolution.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, members, this is an
