CLERK: Mr. President, I have notice of hearing from the Revenue Committee, notice of hearing from the Constitutional Revisions and Recreation, and from Judiciary. Those are signed by their respective chairs.

Mr. President, Business and Labor reports 340 to General File, 346 to General File and 533...I am sorry 340 is by Business and Labor to General File and signed by Senator Barrett; 346 is to General File; and Revenue reports 533 to General File with amendments. Mr. President, Senator Beutler would like to print amendments to 223; Senator Hoagland would move for a rules suspension to allow for the introduction of a bill. That will be laid over. Mr. President, I have unanimous consent request from Senator Rod Johnson to add his name to 422 and Senator Warner to 159. (See page 728 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: No objections, so ordered.

CLERK: I have LR 51 is ready for your signature, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 51. Senator Wesely. Senator Lamb, did you wish to close, please?
