

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President. I rise simply to agree with Senator Wesely in the sense that this was a very small bill which has turned into a major, major enterprise. There does seem to be some confusion only with regard to two or three words in Section 2 of the bill, correction, subsection 5 of the bill which refers to substantial supervisory activities. Inasmuch as there is so much confusion, I would be very happy to work with Senator Wesely in an effort to compromise the situation, if that is possible. I would urge the body to advance the bill to Select File where we will have a chance to work on it. Thank you, Mr. President.
