

SENATOR DECAMP: I'll make my attempt, assuming if the bill advances, I'll do what I want to attempt to do probably on Final, although I think it should be done now.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Five are excused, Senator Wesely. Have you all voted that care to? Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I guess I'd ask for a call of the house and call ins, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. All those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. So if you are here, please record your presence. Please record your presence, ladies and gentlemen. Senator Wesely, did you say you'd accept call ins?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We are voting on the advancement of the bill, ladies and gentlemen. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to ask for a roll call, when we all get here.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, thank you. Senator Beutler, would you check in, please. Senator Abboud. Senator Harris. I believe we are waiting for Senator Harris. Roll call has been asked for. We'll have it as soon as Senator Harris gets here. While we're waiting, I'll introduce a previous senator here, Senator Von Minden, would you stand up, please, and be recognized. Thank you. Okay, I guess we're all here now. We're voting on the advancement of the bill. Roll has been requested. Mr. Clerk.
