PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR SCHMIT: But since some of you do not want to listen, I'm going to tell you again. '73, beef price freeze; '73, soybean embargo; '73, termination of the grain sale to Russia; '74, embargo; '75, President Ford's embargo; '79, deregulation of the cost of money; 1980, President Carter's embargo. By a partisan effort on the behalf of the administrations to beat the hell out of American agriculture and every one of those dollars has come out of the pockets of Nebraska farmers and now has eventually come out of the pockets of the bankers and the laboring men and the businessmen of this state. You keep on vacillating if you want to, I think we ought to continue the discussion of this resolution. I hope we have some more information, we may have enough information to vote today, but I do not think we ought to vote hastily, but we ought to know exactly what is proposed wherever we are going to go and then act in some kind of concert. Thank you very much, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins, do you wish to be heard?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. I'll be brief. Once again the agricultural senators have put me between a rock and a hard place because as I said, being an urban senator, I'm not that familiar with agricultural problems and now I hear some of you disagreeing about this resolution so I don't know which way to go to support agriculture. But I would like to remind you of one thing and make a suggestion on this resolution. We have right now President Reagan and I think that you ought to add a line to the resolution and I think you ought to add another person that the resolution should go to. I don't think there is a Republican colleague here that would disagree with me when I say four years from now George Bush will be running for President. So I think a copy of it ought to be sent to George Bush, or excuse me, Vice-President Bush. I did not mean to not use his title.

PRESIDENT: George will understand.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I think Vice...isn't it, Vice-President George Bush, what's his name?
