PRESIDENT: The motion fails. The Chair would like to announce that Senator Scofield has a guest under the north balcony, Colleen Hinds from Hemingford, from Chadron State College, a student Senate President out there. SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, I still support the resolution as I said I would. I believe the language that Senator DeCamp spoke of would have been a bit conciliatory and it might have been more acceptable back East, but I want to say very frankly and very bluntly that a week ago today five of us sat in the Vice President's office and were reassured that the situation was going to change in the Farmers Home Administration offices across the State of Nebraska and across the Middle West. I can tell you very bluntly it has not changed. The situation has not improved notwithstanding the fact that some people have supposedly been made available. I visited with several people from some of those offices and their ability to hire the kind of people who we know they need has been limited and restricted.
