

both. Okay, Senator Rupp, please.

SENATOR RUPP: Yes, Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I concur. We didn't have much debate on this bill either on General or on Select File. But, as Senator Beutler said, it does give arresting authority to those four park rangers stationed at those three national monuments on federal property only. It was the result of an interim study last year. It is the result of a request by Congress, several years ago, that states grant them this authority. I think we would be the 27th or 28th state, nationwide, to comply. I have no problem with the amendment. I urge that we return the bill to Select File and adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the bill be returned for an amendment? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is returned. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: (Response inaudible.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler moves the adoption of the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I move the bill be readvanced.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. LB 405.

CLERK: (Final Reading of LB 405.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We have a board malfunction. Hold tight. Try it now. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
