

tuition in my district, Senator Landis. You all pay the same regardless and so it isn't like my dad went around and said I'm going to send her to the cheapest school. It wouldn't have made any difference. We pay a tremendous amount of money for that. That is a very serious problem. We need to solve it. That is the good thing I can say about 662 is it would probably solve that, but I think there is a better way to do that. This bill has a number of problems that concern me. Senator Lamb has pointed out one and we've hastily concocted an amendment this morning that we don't even know whether it will solve that. I don't know for sure what impact the decision of the committee currently working Amendment 4 will have on the way this particular bill will be enacted. And maybe we're going to create new inequities in the place of old inequities. I think Senator DeCamp best summarized it when he said that the bill simply doesn't address our overall problem with how we finance our schools. It is obvious to me that the proponents have not really thought through the implementation phase of this bill and I do not say that in a way to chastise any of you particularly, it's just that I don't think that you necessarily have thought through all the nuts and bolts aspect of this and I think it's very important that we do that in view of the kind of feeling that I'd like to have left out there when we're finished accomplishing some very necessary things. I've heard the word here raised talk about consensus. Well let me tell you how you get consensus. You don't sit in one part of the state, cook up a bill, shoot it out on the floor and say, trust us, we'll fix all these little details later. I think you do it the way the Japanese do and you sit down and you argue as long as you have to and you work out all the problems...
