SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. We're back to the bill. Do you have anything further on it?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Excuse me a second, the call is raised.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you. I'm thoroughly confused as to whether or not I should support LB 662 and that is the reason I voted not to kill. I think after listening to Senator Scofield, and I just put that motion up there now, there is some work to be done. We have never had an interim study other than on the funding and I think that, and I'm not going to go into detail why we should have an interim study. I think there has been enough debate. I just want to see whether there are 25 people here that feel that with the Revenue Committee, the Education Committee and the Exec Board, whether or not we couldn't have an interim study. I'm very, very concerned about the taxation issue myself. I feel very strongly about using the education of children to push through a bill so quickly and I cannot, in my own mind, justify transportation of young children, including kindergarten children on country roads. I feel that, and I have always felt very strongly about the people in my district or any community, whether it be the county or the city, their right to control by local school boards and funding of their rural schools.
