SENATOR DECAMP: No, let's let that one go. Okay, next bill, LB 371, read it.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Final Reading of LB 371.)

SENATOR DECAMP: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 371 pass?

CLERK: Senator DeCamp voting yes.

SENATOR DECAMP: Record.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on pages 853-854 of the Legislative Journal.) 47 ayes, 0 nays, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR DECAMP: The bill is declared passed. The Clerk will read LB 87. We're not reading 87, we're holding it up for an A bill. How about 406? We're not reading 406 either I learned, that means we are done with Final Reading. We
