SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Johnson, do you wish to close?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I would wish to close on the bill. I think again, as Senator Higgins points out, it is a hard bill to understand. She has read the material. She couldn't understand it. The committee spent quite a bit of time simply eliciting testimony from the Revenue Department so at least if the committee put the bill on the floor I could get up and speak with some degree of understanding. It is not as difficult as one might think, but I will simply point out that this measure is one that modernizes the methodology of taxing major public service type corporations and then distributing the tax among the counties in which that corporation does business. I think that we ought to advance this bill. There will be a small A bill required which I will introduce, it's like an \$18,000 A bill, and that's it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp, your light is on. Did you wish to...?

SENATOR DECAMP: Oh, you've closed.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes. Senator Vard Johnson, do you wish to give him some time?

SENATOR DECAMP: Then I'll quit talking. No, no, forget it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: He doesn't need it. All right. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the advancement of the bill. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 269.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 269 is advanced. Do you have anything to read in, Mr. Clerk?
