All it means is every time we have got a bill that has a huge encompassing quality, there is going to be nothing you can do about it and you better not offer any amendments from the floor because they are not germane. The subject of taxation is in the bill. I am entitled to offer a different concept of what the appropriate taxation level should be for fraternal organizations.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is, shall the Chair be overruled? Those in support vote aye. Those opposed vote no. It takes 23 votes to overrule the Chair. Have you all voted? Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Judging by my personal impression of the importance of this issue for the remainder of the session, I would ask for a call of the house. I will accept call in votes but I intend to proceed to a roll call vote and for those members who are absent, I would hope that the Clerk will be able to explain the nature of the question before the house.

SENATOR LAMB: Shall the house go under call? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel will please the floor. All senators please check in. While we are recording our presence, I would introduce 60 eighth grade students from Mary Our Queen School in Omaha from Senator Hannibal's district in the north balcony. Would you welcome these students, please. Looking for Senator Conway, Senator Eret, Senator Harris, Senator Hefner, Senator Hoagland. Also looking for Senator Wesely. Would the Sergeant-at-Arms try to find Senator Wesely and Senator Hefner, please. Proceed with the roll call, Mr. Clerk. I am informed that it now takes 22 affirmative votes to overrule the Chair.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 867 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR LAMB: The Chair is not overruled.
