

cleans up language in lines 11 and 12 of page 10 of the bill. If you want to follow, it is lines 11 and 12 of page 10 of the bill. And all it does is put a period at the end of line 11 and then changes the first part of the sentence of line 12 so that it says, each applicant for registration shall take a written examination. It doesn't change anybody's intent with regard to any meaning in the bill. It simply technically changes the language to more clearly state what everybody intends. I ask the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: This one is okay.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, to speak on the amendment offered.

SENATOR WARNER: That is all I was going to say too.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Beutler? If not, the issue is to vote upon the amendment. All those in favor of adopting the Beutler amendment vote aye, opposed vote nay. We are voting on the Beutler amendment to LB 47. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Beutler's first amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Another amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Beutler. Senator, this is Request 280.

PRESIDENT: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Clerk, 280 I think should be Senator Morehead's amendment. In any event, 280...

CLERK: I had...it is, Senator, excuse me, it was filed in two different places. Senator Morehead offers the amendment, Mr. President. (The Morehead amendment appears on page 874 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Morehead.
