For Senator Harris, when you talk about a world market system, the people who deal in these types of operations, whether it is automobiles, steel, dope, agricultural products or whatever, do not look at national boundaries. They have interests in common which transcend the boundaries and the sillinesses that crop up in discussions of patriotism, national loyalty and things of that order. It is why you can find a man like Armand Hammer, the Chairman of Occidental Petroleum, being able to talk to the heads of the communist government in Russia whenever he chooses. And although Jessie Jackson was strongly criticized for going to Syria to bring back an American pilot, Armand Hammer is never criticized or impeded in any way when he has his high level economic discussions with the heads of communist governments. So, Senator Harris, if soybeans can be grown cheaper in Argentina, and America is going to give loans to Argentina to underwrite their economy, soybeans are going to be grown in Argentina. Unless you have a setup, with reference to agriculture, that you had when the government imposed imports on foreign automobiles, then the farmers in this country are going to be playing games, by that I mean they will be spinning their wheels, a lot of activity but going no place.
