

Voting aye, Pat.

CLERK: Senator Beutler voting yes.

We, frankly in the hearing, heard of only a couple of cases that might relate to it. It is not a frequent practice. Most of our employers are not the kind of people that would do that. So this is a very rare instance that you would have this problem. So we did not anticipate a real problem with EOC being able to handle it. So it is important that we recognize, though, in our statutes that people that want to uphold the law and not lose their job as a result of that, it is a simple principle and one that we ought to have in our statutes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay the motion is the advancement of LB 324 from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting aye, Pat.
