

equally or more significant bills, and I guess I would ask Senator Vickers first if you would accept an amendment, Senator Vickers, on Select File that would adequately protect the courts against being required under all circumstances to take a personal check in payment of a fine as the language of your amendment would do?

SENATOR VICKERS: Well, Senator Hoagland, I would be happy to visit with you between now and Select File. I am not certain that I am ready at this point in time to say, yes, I am going to accept that amendment, largely because I don't know how that would be implemented. I guess my concern is that courts may say, well, we don't have to mess around with the worry about insufficient fund checks, therefore, we are not going to take any checks at all and that is not my intention at all and I would hope it wouldn't be yours either. So I will be willing to discuss it further with you, but I would only add that if the court system of this state cannot collect on insufficient fund checks, cannot protect themselves from insufficient fund checks, I don't know how in the world they expect us as individual businessmen to do it.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: And, Senator Conway, I wonder if you would be willing on Select File to work out an amendment that would adequately protect the courts?

SENATOR CONWAY: Certainly, I think there is a question as to, like you say, some bit of discretion by virtue of the ability to supply appropriate identification and permanent residence and other kinds of qualifications that as any businessman ordinarily you would follow that process, so I think something in that area would be perfectly acceptable.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Thank you, Senator Conway. With that, Mr. President, I would reluctantly support this amendment but I do think if we can't get this problem ironed out we could have a serious problem down the road. Thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Rogers. Senator Rogers.
