

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the indefinite postponement of the bill. All those in favor of killing the bill vote aye, opposed nay. A simple majority wins. Please vote if you care to. I have an important announcement after this is over. Have you all voted? I'm going to call it. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: (Response inaudible.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Thank you. There are six excused. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: After everyone is reported in, Mr. Speaker, I'd request a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. We're looking for Senator Beutler, Senator Peterson, Senator Scofield, Warner, Smith, Vickers. Senator Lynch, would you punch in, please. Senator Higgins, Senator Dick Peterson. A roll call vote has been asked for and we're voting on the indefinite postponement of the bill. Mr. Clerk. Let's have it quiet so we can hear the response, thank you.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Changing to not voting.

CLERK: Senator Chambers changing from no to not voting.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The call is raised, however, I have an important announcement.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp changing from no to yes for purposes of reconsideration. Mr. President, the vote is 24 ayes, 19 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone the bill. (See page 904 of the Legislative
