So for that reason I'm objecting.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis, did you wish to close, please?

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, I would be happy to divide the question for the separate bills. If Senator Chambers's which is characteristically the most controversial of the measures should be laid over for a week I can reschedule it, but I have a committee right now that has one noncontroversial bill set for Thursday and no other work load before it. Now we can't cancel the whole hearing, we have to be there, but we don't have a work load that justifies us spending the whole afternoon. I would be happy to lump the other two, about which there are no proponents or opponents that I know of who can't make it, if we could lump those two and then single out Senator Chambers' I'd be happy to divide the question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: So what you're asking is to suspend the rules on 467 and 471...

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SPEAKER NICHOL: ...and delete 499?

SENATOR LANDIS: I'll delete 499, put that off for another week.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. No objection? So ordered. So the question is the suspension of the rules. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Excuse me. Record, Mr. Clerk.
