

now if you vote for this amendment, essentially we will meet on the fifth Wednesday after the general election which will be December 1st to December 7th. That would be when we'd start meeting. So that would be the first week of December essentially. If you don't adopt this amendment then the resolution would have us meet December 8th to December 14th so essentially we'd gain a full week and would meet on a Wednesday. And one of the reasons we made it a Wednesday is so that Monday and Tuesday would be open if you wanted to come in and do a legislative council thing, if you still want to do those. You could have those on a Monday and Tuesday, come down Wednesday, meet Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and go home till January. Or you could if you wanted to, stay longer. It would really be up the Legislature, but that's what this amendment does and I'd ask your support for it.

PRESIDENT: The motion is the adoption of the Wesely amendment to the resolution. Is there further discussion? All those in favor of the amendment vote aye, opposed vote nay. We're voting on an amendment offered by Senator Wesely to LR 23 which is a proposed constitutional amendment. Will you please record your vote on the Wesely amendment? The Chair will allow 15 seconds for the recording of your votes. The motion before you is the adoption of an amendment explained by Senator Wesely. Please record your vote. Senator Wesely, I'm going to call the time here. What do you wish?

SENATOR WESELY: I wish that people would have listened to what I have explained and then did.

PRESIDENT: The motion before you is the adoption of the Wesely amendment. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, why don't we have a call of the house, please.

PRESIDENT: A call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.
