

is the homeowner. To Northwestern Bell you will give \$30,000. To Trailblazer Pipeline you will give \$22,000 because they are paying \$220,000 in property taxes in that one county alone. To the Kiewitt Ranch...to the what? To the Kiewitt Ranch you would give...they pay \$76,000 and you would be giving, obviously, \$7,600. To the N. W. Public Service, \$70,000. To K & N Energy, they are paying 40 so you would be giving them ten percent four. Haythorn Ranch, paying \$40,000 in taxes. Burlington Northern paying \$37,000 in taxes. AT&T, \$35,000. In each of these cases these individuals or corporations fall in the groups that have probably benefited more from the various tax relief programs that we offered over the years than anybody. They don't pay their utility tax like the homeowner does. They did get personal property tax relief in massive amounts. They do have the ability to pass on their property tax as a cost of business onto their customers. Now let's take Lancaster County just to illustrate my point, the necessity for some kind of a cap so that your dollars, so that your dollars will have maximum impact. LT&T pays \$2,350,000 roughly in property tax. You would be giving LT&T a direct rebate of about \$100,000 then. Ninety...yes, on the basis of the taxes about \$100,000 direct rebate. You would be giving Bankers Life of Nebraska seventy...no, I take that back, LT&T, I screwed that all up. LT&T you would be giving \$235,000, not \$100,000, I'm sorry. You would be giving them a check for \$235,000. You would be giving Bankers Life of Nebraska, an insurance company which, of course, pays an excessive premium tax, \$70,000. You would be giving Burlington Northern 45...\$46,000 direct rebate. You would be giving Minnegasco \$42,000; Goodyear, \$35,000 in direct rebate. And remember, this is only... I am giving you the rebate, the ten percent you are giving back. Their taxes are ten times that. Norden Labs, you would be giving \$33,000. They are paying 330 in taxes. First National Lincoln, \$27,000 you would be giving them; IBM, \$225,000. Remember, IBM was one of the beneficiaries, you would be giving...you made me lose my train of thought. Well, anyway you would be giving them lots of money. NBC Bank, NBC Bank, you would be giving them a direct check for \$25,000. Archer Daniels Midland, you would be giving them a check for \$17,000. You see my point. These are just randomly some of the top taxpayers. If you use the ten percent direct rebate without "a cap or a circuit breaker", you will find yourselves in the same trouble as the personal property tax and that is why I would submit to you that you must maximize
