

unless it is fair and justified for every one of us. And could we hold this...I mean, I will be willing to try to get the figures this afternoon, if I can, from the Revenue Department and see what the total figure...if it is...we all know if it is over a cent sales tax, it probably will not go, and I would like to do that.

PRESIDENT: There are other people to speak so maybe we will run it out anyway. Senator DeCamp. Senator Rod Johnson, excuse me, Rod Johnson. Don't see him? Motion is the Nelson amendment to the committee amendments. Next is Senator DeCamp. Senator DeCamp, do you wish to speak on the Nelson amendment?

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, Arlene and I have been talking about this. Obviously, I want two concepts. One is a cap and one is more than 10 percent reduction in property tax for the average person. Hers accomplishes both. It is a variation of mine. Mine was 300 and 30 percent, hers is 25 percent and 500. What I would hope...we have established the concept, at last on that one vote and whether it holds or not, I don't know. We established the concept that we want a bigger rebate, a bigger impact in lowering property tax and some cap. What I would suggest is, get together with Senator Johnson and some of those people in the Revenue Department, get the exact numbers, if you can, so that if the bill is on Select File, I'm sure it will be battled there if it advances, you could offer the amendment there with exact figures and we would know where we were. That is just a suggestion. But whatever you think is right.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, do you wish to speak on this point? Do you want to withdraw it or do you want to...? Are you withdrawing your amendment, Senator Nelson?

SENATOR NELSON: By withdrawing my amendment, that will give us the opportunity to try to work these figures out. So we...we are kind of talking...gosh, we are guessing and we can't guess on something this important. So I would like to do that. That would be fine.

PRESIDENT: You wish to withdraw at this time. Without objection, so ordered. Allowed. Now then what do we have, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend the
