SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Thank you, Senator Chambers. That issue did come up before the body and we are proposing that the Director of Health now under the committee amendments would make the appointments. Under the original bill it was the Board of Health. We don't specify exactly who has to be what and how they are represented.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Wait a minute, the director of what?

SENATOR WESELY: The Director of Health.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, the Director of Health will make the appointment. There will still be six members.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now where will they come from?

SENATOR WESELY: We don't specify that. It is up to the Director of Health. Now the reason we don't is that you get into so many variables. You have 11 different proposals now and how you approach each one will be different so we are looking at the concept Senator Smith said is kind of what I would hope to have happen, have both sides are represented, maybe two each and then some lay people, two lay people.
