SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so then Senator Smith, what she had said about three from the group seeking licensure and three from wherever else is not an amendment yet being offered?

SENATOR WESELY: Right, it is not in the committee amendments or they are not in the bill, but that is one option the director has in making the appointments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So right now and then I'll have it crystal clear, there will be...there is no guideline existing right now in the bill or the offered committee amendments as to where the members will come from or what interests or they will represent?

SENATOR WESELY: Right, there is no specifications in there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I wanted to be clear on that. Thank you, Senator Wesely. I think I may have to make a comment anyway since we're on that subject. The best way to deal with something new is to talk about something old. There is a new Attorney General for whom I have the "profoundest" respect. We have a discredited Attorney General who has destroyed any reason for anybody to respect him as a professional. However, the judgment on that discredited person after the jurors consisting of members of the public made their determination that he committed three felonies, he was judged ultimately by members of his own profession, other lawyers. Paul Douglas' right-hand man in his office misused his office to get information on the criminal history of an individual and turned it over to the defense team which was definitely unethical, unethical and a conflict of interest.
