

requests, and I go back to another senator who said he is no expert in this field. You know, I am on the Banking Committee, I have no expertise in banking, I can't even balance my checkbook. So my amendment is very simple. It merely says...and I think it makes sense, if you have listened to Senator Wesely and if you have listened to other members of the Public Health and Welfare, this makes sense for every committee in this Legislature that doesn't want to face up to the duties of their committee. I move that LB 407 be applied to the insurance industry, the real estate industry, the banking industry, the agricultural industry and the construction industry, and, of course, I would redraft this amendment to include every industry because Senator Chambers is not an expert on every industry. Senator Jackie Smith who sits here and pulls at my skirt all the time...she is a first year senator, I am sure she will admit of the 715 bills we have she is no expert. So why shouldn't we get a board for every legislative committee and then take the directors like the Director of Insurance, the Department of Roads Director, he could handle construction, and let those directors talk to the people, not us, and let them listen to the professionals and let them appoint a board made up partly of their peers and then that board could decide and make a recommendation to the director of whether or not a life insurance agent ought to be allowed to become a certified life insurance underwriter. I think that makes sense. Think of the work it would take off of the legislative committees. Why we might not ever have any bills. We might be able to get through these legislative sessions just zip, zip zip. All we have to do is appoint boards to listen to different professional groups and we will appoint the director to pick who is going to be on that group. And, of course, I have the greatest of trust in all of the directors that the Governor has appointed. As Senator Withem pointed out, the triple trailer bill last year, there were trades made on that and there were trades made on various other bills because of lobbyists. Now I cannot conceive of a board that the Director of Health would appoint and he would put a couple of doctors on and a couple of nurses on it and a couple of whatever. Can any of you see that board saying, hey, doctor so and so, if you recommend against a physician's assistant, I will give you a vote when it comes time to those dental hygienists. I don't think they do vote trading like that. They are professionals. They wouldn't do anything that we have been accused of doing or that lobbyists are accused of doing. I
