

mean, they are not human beings like us. They are professionals. So all I am saying is, Senators, each legislative committee should tell all the professionals that come before them, like me on the Banking Committee, when they come in with a bill for banking they can't come to us until they have first been to the Banking Director and the board that he has appointed to listen to the banking problems. That wouldn't slow up the process, would it? I mean, we have passed some emergency legislation here for banks this year, but I will tell you the truth, that Banking Committee is tough, especially for somebody like me that is not a banker and I am not an expert. I do try to learn and I do have two brand new books on banking that I am reading so I will learn more about it, but then I enjoy learning. But I think this is the answer to the problem for the whole Legislature. I think we should adopt this amendment and then we can have the Legislature let department directors make decisions on what should come before this Legislature and what shouldn't. So I would urge the adoption of this amendment because it is going to help the legislative committees and it is going to send a message to the people, don't bother us, you have got a problem, you go to the board that we had created, but our duty as senators is only to look at bills after we have appointed a board or after we have had the director of a various agency appoint a board that is going to come to us and give us the facts and we know that board is not going to be prejudicial. They are not going to do any vote trading because, again, whomever the Director of the Department of Roads appoints to be on their board, they are not going to be ordinary human beings. They are going to be special people that don't ever trade votes. So with that said, I know I could talk longer, but with that said, I would urge the adoption of this amendment to LB 407 which I would give to the bill drafters to put in better order and include all the industries, every industry in the state that comes before this Legislature since none of us are experts on everything. This might be the answer to the problem for the whole Legislature and we wouldn't have 715 bills. We might only have 20, depending on how many of those boards want to direct men to the director and the director wanted to recommend to the Legislature. I urge the adoption of this amendment because it is going to do so much for the Legislature. It might not do much for the people.
