

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. Chairman, I will not ask for a call of the house, but I would like to have a record vote and have it read who voted for the amendment, against it and who didn't vote at all. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Clerk would accommodate you on a record vote.

CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 963 of the Legislative Journal.) 8 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, I requested that the Clerk would read the names of all of those not voting also.

CLERK: Mr. President, not voting, Senators Barrett, Beutler, Chizek, Chronister, DeCamp, Eret, Goll, Goodrich, Harris, Rod Johnson, Vard Johnson, Landis, Miller, Nelson, Nichol, Peterson, Rogers, Rupp, Schmit, Scofield, Sieck, and Vickers. 8 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. The amendment fails. Anything further?

CLERK: I have nothing further to the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Back to the bill then. Senator Wesely, we are back to your bill. Next, Senator Hannibal. Hannibal, do you wish to speak on the bill? After Senator Hannibal we have recognition lights for Senators Hall, Chambers, Higgins, Chronister, Remmers, Withem and Wesely. Senator Hannibal.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. President and members of the body, I realize we have spent an awful lot of time on this and I won't take but just a minute but I do want to express some reservations with the bill also. I am in full sympathy with what the members of the committee have gone up on the floor and have said with regards to the problems we have in determining increasing scope of practice or entry into the fields or licensure in general. They have asked me off the mike and I can't give them a good answer whether I can come up with a better solution. I am not sure that I can. In fact, I know that I don't have a better solution in mind. However, I am quite concerned that what we are going to do
