

to suspend Rule 6, Section 3, Rule 7, Section 3, and we will vote without further debate and without further amendments on the advancement of LB 407.

PRESIDENT: The motion is debatable. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. There is an amendment pending and other motions that can be brought forward, other amendments. We almost had a chance to vote on this bill about half an hour ago when Senator Chambers was able to get up there and place his kill motion, but just before the vote was announced. I think it is time to stop the harassment and the effort to try and keep us from voting on the issue. I would like very much to adopt this and move forward and vote on the issue and get going on it. So that is what the motion is.

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Point of order, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I would just take exception to Senator Wesely's remarks that Senator Chambers or myself or anyone else who opposed this bill did so just to harass the Legislature. My intentions were sincere and I know Senator Chambers' said intentions were sincere. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely's motion is to suspend the rules and proceed without delay on the vote on this bill. Is there discussion? Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Mr. President. I have the pending motion and I do not know about any others. My pending motion is to put a sunset clause in the bill. I am not supportive of LB 407, but it obviously has a strong support on this legislative floor. When we are making such a radical change, I think it is entirely reasonable to put a sunset clause so that we will take another look at this proposal after having given it time to function and if it is a well functioning facility and it is doing just exactly what the members of the Legislature want, then it will automatically continue with action from this body. But I do not support 407 in its current form and feel that that is a
