LB 97, 424

CLERK: Mr. President, 97 was a bill that was introduced by Senator Schmit. (Read title.) It was first read on January 10, referred to the Agriculture and Environment Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 97 is a very simple bill. It provides that in the event that a livestock auction market is not operated for a year that the license to operate such market shall terminate and in the event it should be sold or should be attempted to be placed back on the market, they would have to come back to the Department of Agriculture and request for another license. The idea behind the bill is to provide some additional control through the Department so that the markets are operated in a lawful and efficient and effective manner and are not operated in any manner which might be detrimental to the public or to the individuals involved. I would move the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on this bill? If not, the motion is to advance LB 97. All those in favor vote yes, opposed vote no. Have you all voted on the advancement of LB 97? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to advance LB 97.

PRESIDENT: LB 97 is advanced. LB 424.

CLERK: Mr. President, 424 was a bill that was introduced by the Government Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT: Is Senator Landis here? Senator Abboud, Vice-Chairman.

CLERK: It was read on January 18, referred to the Government Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Abboud, do you want to take this?

SENATOR ABELOUD: Is Senator Landis...Mr. President, is Senator...I don't believe he is in the room.
