The Chair will allow 15 seconds for the recording of your votes. You're voting on the Scofield amendment. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote. Okay, a call of the house has been requested. The question is now, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The house is under call. All members return to your seats, record your presence. Look up to the green light board, members, and see that your green light is on indicating your presence. Still two members excused. Two members excused.
