CLERK: Senator Schmit, this is that amendment you had filed earlier, Senator.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Do I have a more recent amendment?

CLERK: No, sir, not yet.

SENATOR SCHMIT: It's not here then yet.

CLERK: Are you going to withdraw this one I have, Senator?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, withdraw that one.

CLERK: Mr. President, I then have a motion by Senator Hoagland to strike the Landis amendment.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Withdraw that.

CLERK: Senator Jackie Smith would move to amend.

SENATOR SMITH: I have another version, of what I gave you, coming. It is not here yet. Could I hold for just a minute, or is there anything else that can go on ahead of me?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do we have anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I think there is one on its way, Mr. President. Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this amendment is a rather lengthy amendment, but I would like to point out to you that I am sorry I do not have copies for all of you. This is the amendment which I discussed yesterday. It refers to page 24, Section 39, provides that there shall be a limitation on the amount of funding from the rural...from the real estate, any real estate. In other words it is a limitation and it is a provision which will provide that there is going to be sales and income tax support for the school. We've had a lot of discussion here on this floor relative to quality of education.
