

a long and illustrious career in state government. He was a Tax Commissioner in Governor Tiemann's term, had the privilege of implementing the so-called Tiemann tax. During the 1970's he was the Legislative Ombudsman and in that capacity many of us came to know him quite well. He assumed a position, an acting position as a member of the Board of Pardons in mid-November of last year and has been actively involved in that capacity since. Governor Kerrey appointed him. We in the Judiciary Committee unanimously recommend confirmation of that appointment to the Board of Pardons. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? The question is the acceptance of the report. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Judiciary Committee report.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The report is accepted. Well, we will move on. Senator Chambers has reconsideration of LB 72. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 72 is the bill that relates to gambling. (Read title.) The bill was read in January. It was referred to the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There was consideration of the measure on March 8 and March 11. On March 11 there was a motion to indefinitely postpone offered that prevailed. Senator Chambers, pursuant to that action, filed a motion to reconsider that motion, Mr. President. Senator Chambers' motion is found on page 936 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Could we please have it quiet so we can hear those speaking, please. Just a minute, Senator. Thank you. Senator Chambers.
