I think it is up to the clerks of the different counties to see to it that you are not pulling everybody from one area of your jurisdiction and that they do get scattered throughout the area. So I really feel that we have got a system here that is working, why change it. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Pappas, please.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I rise to support the override motion presented by Senator Withem and several things I would like to add and talk about, Senator Barrett went on about the apathetic, the people are too apathetic to vote, wouldn't make good jurors. I would like to remind everybody in this body that the attorneys on both sides are the ones that make the jury selection. It is not automatic, if you get called, you sit on a jury. But probably the biggest thing I would like to have everybody listen to and listen to very carefully is for the last three years...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Excuse me, Senator Pappas. Would you please hold it down so you can hear what Senator Pappas is saying. Thank you.

SENATOR PAPPAS: For the last three years, the Clerk of the District Court in Lincoln County has called me and has been against this bill, has been against this bill every year until this year. This year I got a note from her and said I can vote either way as far as she is concerned. So I called her and asked her why. And she said in the last three or four months, the last three or four months, there have been people going down to the court house to remove their names from voter registration lists so they wouldn't have to serve on a jury.
