SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Higgins, please, then Senator Chambers, then Senator Pirsch. Senator Higgins, are you about? The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. You are voting to cease debate. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate has ceased. Senator Withem, would you like to close please?

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, I would, Mr. President, members of the body, sorry for yelling into that. You had the sound turned up a little high, I guess. I have enjoyed the discussion today. I am very interested that we have had a lot more discussion on this on the veto override itself than we did either on General File, Select File, or even during the committee hearings but I have enjoyed the discussion. I would like to respond to two or three things that were brought up. First of all, Senator Haberman referred to a fiscal note in the book, came from Lancaster County, indicating over a two-year period a cost of \$65,000 to implement this. I indicated when I started my speech that we have had some revised fiscal notes as a result of the amendment put on the bill in committee. If you refer to that, you will see that Lancaster County now thinks it will probably cost them about \$13,000 over a two-year period and emphasized that consistently the Lancaster County people that have to administer this program and spend this money have been supportive of this bill.
