Senator Rupp would like to print amendments to LB 94 in the Journal, and in conjunction with your announcement, Mr. President, I have a communication to the Secretary of State for delivery of LB 113. Mr. President, also Senator Conway would like to print amendments to 132 in the Journal and Senator Vickers amendments to 356. (See pages 1079-80 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, the next amendment I have to 407 is by Senator Chambers and, Senator, your amendment is on page 979 of the Journal.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I can tell you...what page in the Journal is that on, because it may not be the amendment that I want now.

CLERK: 979.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let me take a minute. Yes, if you will look at page 2 on your green sheet, I can tell you what this amendment will do and it will be clearer than just reading what is in the Journal, although I am going to say the same thing in different words. On line 17 put a period after the word "public". Then strike the remaining language on that page and this is the language which would be stricken, "by restricting entry into the profession. When such a need is identified, the state should regulate the entry in the least restrictive manner consistent with the public interest to be protected. It is the intent of the Legislature that no rule or regulation shall, after January 1, 1985, be imposed upon any health profession except for the exclusive purpose of protecting the public interest. All bills introduced into the Legislature should be reviewed according to the criteria established in Section 19 of this act." If you read the language and you take the language to mean what it says, any bill that is offered into the Legislature, should this piece of legislation here become law, would be subject to provisions stated elsewhere, found elsewhere in this bill. First of all, it is bad legislating because the Legislature cannot be bound by what a prior Legislature will do but it is just showing the arrogance of the ones who are pushing this bill and the lack of concern for the public's interest of those who are carrying it on the floor of the Legislature.
