

now I want you to introduce this bill for my industry. Why should we just let the health care industry be protected in this way? Every possible industry is going to be down here saying, we want you to introduce a bill that the Public Works Committee will have to go before the Health Director who will then give the idea to the subcommittee. The committee will study it, take it back to the health board, back to the Health Director, and then eventually one day it will reach the Legislature, maybe, perhaps, depending upon who is appointed to these committees. But the main thing is, if this bill passes without the Chambers amendment, then we Senators are going to have our hands tied. We are taking away a lot of legislative power and putting it in the hands of others. I sympathize with Senator Wesely and I sympathize with the Public Health and Welfare Committee. I have served on that committee three years. I know what it is like to sit there and listen to the voice of the people who want to be regulated, who want to be licensed, but just a few minutes ago, Senators, you heard Senator Wesely say, these are people who don't want anybody else in here. These are people that don't want anybody else to be licensed or regulated that come before the Public Health and Welfare Committee. Yet those are the people that wrote all of us a letter saying we are supporting this bill. Remember, the list of the nurses that have become specialized and now they want to pull the ladder up and say, don't let anybody else do it. So I urge you to adopt the Chambers amendment because I do think it makes the bill more palatable and a better bill for we, as Senators, who have a responsibility to the people. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
