SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Is it possible, Senator Beyer, just to hold this until the next Final Reading, and try to resolve this?

SENATOR BEYER: I have no objection, if you think it is that big a problem with it. I mean we can find out.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, I could be wrong, but if I'm right I think it is a problem.

SENATOR BEYER: No, I'd be willing to check it out because what we are trying to do is get a model bill. This was approved by the Department of Insurance Director, along with the fraternal, to come up with this. It is basically the same bill, same language they are using all the way across the nation as they are doing this.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, okay.

SENATOR BEYER: Because the bill in itself, you could be right on some technical questions, but the bill in itself is basically giving the Director of Insurance more authority over fraternal that he does not have now. So I would have to check maybe with Mr. Dugan as well as with the people that drafted the bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Again, I apologize for raising it at this point in time, but I don't understand it. I think it is important enough to be understood.

SENATOR BEYER: Well it would have been nice if we could have known a little before Final Reading then we could have at least did some checking. I think it's kind of poor timing to come in in the middle of Final Reading to do it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I didn't see it until just a few minutes ago.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Since the bill has not been returned, I assume we will leave it on Final Reading? All right, then we will pass over it for today.
