CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend the committee amendments by the amendment that is found, as he has referenced, on page 1047 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, we have been in contact with the Revenue...Department of Revenue several times in efforts to work out problems in regard to implementation of the bill. This is an amendment which they brought to me. I suggest that it be adopted. One of the important parts of the bill is on page 1048, Section 6, which would require the Department of Revenue to reimburse the county for all actual costs incurred in collecting, compiling and submitting the report required earlier in this amendment. This amendment does require the county to file a report on a semiannual basis, listing all property taxes paid, by county, in the county, by name and address and social security number. This is an effort to forge a method whereby the Department of Revenue can determine who the taxpayers are and where the money should go. I ask that the amendment be adopted.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp, please.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I support this amendment because no matter what final form LB 38 takes, if it passes, we want to be sure that it can be effectively administered because we are talking about a new type of concept and that is the direct rebate rather than simply the state aid concept. So I think the amendment is important, no matter what final direction we go on LB 38.
