

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR LAMB: Would you yield, Senator Higgins?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Higgins, Senator Lamb is asking a...

SENATOR HIGGINS: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator, I'm suggesting that at least we adopt the committee amendments before we delay the bill and as I said, I'm not sure whether I want to delay it or not, but I think...would you withdraw your motion so that we could at least adopt the committee amendments and then we could decide whether or not to...

SENATOR HIGGINS: I'll tell you what, Senator Lamb, I offered a sincere motion. Senators are coming to me now saying I'm part rural and I'm part agricultural, what committee would I go on? I said you could pick whichever one you wanted, but I'll be happy to withdraw that motion. I'll withdraw the motion completely now. I just was hoping that we could get a consensus of senators to form a coalition and come back to the body Monday and say, this is what we agreed upon, now the rest of the body accept it. I'm just going to withdraw the whole motion, Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I have no objection to that. My only thought was that at least to adopt the committee amendments, then if we want a committee to do that, I'd be happy to participate.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Well, I'll just withdraw the motion now. Thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Higgins has withdrawn the motion. Mr. Clerk, do we have another amendment?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Arlene Nelson would move to amend the committee amendments. (Nelson amendment appears on page 1108 of the Legislative Journal.)
