SENATOR MARSH: Seeing no other lights, we will now vote on the confirmation report as presented by Senator Wesely. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed no. Senator Marsh voting aye.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the confirmation report.

SENATOR MARSH: The confirmation report is adopted. We are now ready for Final Reading. Senators, each person in his or her own seat, please. We are ready for Final Reading. We are ready to begin with LB 94. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, I have a motion on the desk.

SENATOR MARSH: Read the motion.

CLERK: Senator Rupp would move to return LB 94 to Select File for a specific amendment. The amendment is found in your bill books. It is Req. #707.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Rupp.

SENATOR RUPP: Madam Speaker and colleagues, I wish you would all grab your Final Reading copy of your bill book. You might be a little interested in this because I know some of you had had some calls on this. LB 94, in and of itself, is a fairly noncontroversial bill. What we're about to do is put a big saddle on a little horse, hopefully. LB 94 simply raised the damage reporting...the reporting triggering level on property damage from \$250 to \$500 in a motor vehicle accident where you have to report the accident to the Department of Roads. LB 94, if you have your Final Reading bill books out, is found on page 1. The amendment I am proposing is, if you will see down on line 14, "if applicable, has furnished proof of payment, in the form prescribed by the director of Motor Vehicles as directed by
